Funding

This post is out of program experience funded through revenue from our commercial clinical trials program and with employment through Queen Mary University Hospital (QMUL) with an honorary clinical contract at Barts Health NHS Trust. The post holder will be paid a full-time salary matched to the BMA approved rates for specialist trainees with an option to increase this by joining an out of hours GI bleed rota. As such, (unless the candidate wished otherwise) there are no GIM or General Gastro commitments and 100% of the fellows' time is dedicated to IBD Care, clinical trial recruitment and IBD research projects.

About the Department

We are a large tertiary referral centre for patients with inflammatory bowel disease. There are 6 full-time consultants named below, we have a team of five adult clinical nurse specialists in IBD, 2 paediatric / adolescent IBD clinical nurse specialists, paediatric and adult dieticians, access to liaison psychiatry, 2 IBD specialist pharmacists, a dedicated IBD surgical team, intestinal failure team and specialist GI radiology. We estimate we have between 5,000-6,000 patients across young adult and adult services with approximately 5 to 20 in-patients at any one time. The department has broad research interests in both basic sciences and clinical research with a dedicated Clinical Trials Unit in the Wingate Institute part of QMUL. We have a track record of supporting SPR's in both clinical training and in research with numerous trainees completing MD's and PhD's in IBD based research.

Weekly IBD training list with exposure to dye spray, dilatations, clinical trial recordings

Service list – if the candidate would like to join the GI bleed rota then there is an ask to perform 7 Saturday service lists per year. If the candidate wishes there is capacity join other training and or service lists including EMR / ESD.

In-Patient

We run a join specialist in-patient firm for patients with IBD (both medical and surgical) + type 2 & 3 intestinal failure. This is supported by a broad range of specialist allied health care professionals including CNS, pharmacy + dieticians. The post-holder would not normally perform the weekly ward rounds (which is done by the rotating clinical posts) but would attend weekly dedicated in-patient MDT's, will liaise with the clinical team regarding admissions and see patients on the weekend as part of the OOH GI Bleed rota.

Clinical Trials

Join a large team dedicated to clinical research in the Wingate Clinical Trials Unit, this includes a unit manager, 5 additional research nurse and a clinical trial assistant. Good Clinical Practice qualification is mandatory prior to starting post.

The fellow will become sub-investigator to a broad portfolio of commercial and noncommercial clinical trials.

Further personal research is encouraged as well as collaborative work with other centres.

Option to pump-prime MD or PhD – two of our previous fellows have achieved this and two other fellows went on to successfully apply for fellowships in other centres.

iUS

We are currently expanding our iUS capacity and training within the department with one IBD consultant and our current fellow undertaking training with support of two dedicated IBD radiologists.

We have a new US machine in the dept and available for use in clinic.

Supervision

Weekly contact with the IBD team and dedicated supervision time.
